

## Folding Sphinx Tiles


Begin with an A size piece of paper. A4 is most common. Fold the bottom up to sit exactly on top of one of the long sides so that the folded section makes a square. Flatten to make the diagonal of the square. The unfolded section is a rectangle - the Leftover Rectangle. This is what you need to make a Sphinx tile. Fold it, make a very sharp crease and tear it off carefully, or use scissors to cut it off carefully.




Fold in half like this, then unfold.




Fold the bottom right corner onto the vertical centre crease, making sure the bottom left corner remains sharp.




Fold the sloping bottom edge onto the right hand edge.




Open out the fold made in step 3.




Fold the sloping bottom edge upwards like this. Make this fold softly at first.




Make sure the new front flap is aligned like this before you flatten the fold.




Fold the bottom sloping edge upwards again using the edge of the front layer to help you locate the fold accurately.




Fold the right edge onto the bottom sloping edge.



Fold the top tip of the front flap backwards around the edge of the layer behind it, then tuck it into the pocket between the other layers.



Turn over sideways and rotate to look like the next picture.



Whichever way you have made your first Sphinx. Well done. The next step is to draw it on Sphinx Paper using these rules:

- 1. Each corner of the Sphinx must be on a dot.
- 2. You must draw the smallest possible Sphinx using Rule 1.
